As the Pavilion data will be collated by a computer this year by posting your completed entry forms and fees to The Secretary, Picton Show Society, PO Box 34, Picton NSW 2571 by Thursday 30th September, 2010.

### **RESPONSIBILITY**

*Damage through exhibits:* The Society will not be responsible for any accidents that may be caused through or by any exhibit, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accident.

*Damage to exhibits:* The society will not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss or misdelivery of exhibits at the society's show or for any damage thereto.

*Appeals:* All appeals must be lodged with the Secretary, or left at the office of the Secretary, addressed to her, by the close of the show. Such protests, in writing, are to be accompanied by \$20 + GST, which may be forfeited if the protest is considered frivolous.

A fee of \$1.00 per entry applies for each section unless otherwise stated.

Junior Section (aged under 15 years) Free.

Unless otherwise specified, prize money is 1st \$3.00, 2nd \$1.50. Ribbons, trophies and prizes as specified. Prize money for school children 1st \$2.00, 2nd \$1.00.

A minimum of three (3) entries per class or no cash prize (except where stated) will be awarded and this will also apply to School Children's Section. Prize cards will be awarded in all sections.

The Pavilion will open at approximately 10 a.m. Saturday (or when judging is completed) and close at 8 p.m. The pavilion will re-open at 9 a.m. on Sunday.

Prize money and entries to be collected from 2 p.m. to 3 p.m. Sunday 10th October 2010. Perishable items will be disposed of, if not collected.

Any entry may be disqualified at the discretion of the Chief Pavilion Steward.

#### *25 Rich Fruit Cake Competition:*

*Sponsored by the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW. This recipe is compulsory for all entrants.*

*Winners at country shows will each receive a cash prize of \$10 and will be required to bake a second "Rich Fruit Cake" in order to compete in a Group Final to be conducted by each of the fourteen Groups of the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW. The winner from Picton will go onto the Group Final that will be held at Berry on a date to be advised.*

The winners at Group level will each receive a cash prize of \$15, and are required to bake a third "Rich Fruit Cake" for the Final judging at the Royal Easter Show where the winner will receive a cash prize of \$50.00.

*Note:* Competitors may only represent one Show Society in a Group Final and only one Group in a State Final.

### *Compulsory Recipe:*

*Here's what you need:*

250g (8 oz) sultanas;

250g (8 oz) chopped raisins

250g (8 oz) currants

125g (4 oz) chopped, mixed peel

90g (3 oz) chopped red glazed cherries

90g (3 oz) chopped blanched almonds

1/3 cup sherry or brandy

250g (8 oz) plain flour

60g (2 oz) self raising flour

1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

1/2 teaspoon ground cloves

250g (8 oz) butter

250g (8 oz) soft brown sugar

1/2 teaspoon lemon essence **OR** finely grated lemon rind

1/2 teaspoon almond essence

1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence

4 large eggs.

*Here's what you do:*

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.

Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8") and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½-4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

*Note:* To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

### **STATE COMPETITION**

*Competition to be Conducted at  
Society, Group & State Level*

### **THREE DIFFERENT TYPES OF WOOL ARTICLES AND/OR GARMENTS**

*Picton Classes: Section 3 - Class 10; and Section 6 - Class 13*

#### **CONDITIONS:**

1. For the purpose of this competition the following definitions apply:
  - a) *Garment:* an item that can be worn e.g. dress, jacket, scarf, hat
  - b) *Article:* a utility item that is not worn but can be used in the home e.g. blanket, with an outfit eg. bag; for amusement eg. toy; as a decoration eg. picture etc.
2. The whole article and/or garment must be constructed of, and contain a minimum of, 80% wool.
3. Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc and must be hand crafted (use of sewing machine is permitted).
4. A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit. If a label is not available as a handspun/felted, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice.
5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organization.
6. All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.

7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
8. An exhibitor is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level.
9. An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
10. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitors permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.
11. It is the responsibility of the Group Secretary and winner to co-ordinate the transfer of the winning entry to the ASC Office in Sydney for the State judging.
